

Sponsor A Flag

for the 100 Servicemen from Connecticut who lost their lives during the Battle of Iwo Jima

Presently, the flags are posted on a PVC tube anchored to the ground with a metal stake and zip ties. Often, the ties break and the flags tilt or fall to the ground. We have been getting feedback that each of these 100 men deserve a more fitting tribute at the Memorial Park.



We propose to fly these flags in a proper manner. A commercially available aluminum flag pole bracket will be mounted to the fence post with metal straps. A commercially available, 5 foot aluminum flag pole will be inserted into the flag mount. A new 2 ft x 3 ft nylon flag will be attached to rotating flag clips. Finally, a plaque will be posted on the fence by each flag stating which serviceman the flag is in memory of and the name of the person or organization sponsoring the flag unit.

It is our hope that family members, friends, individual sponsors and organizations will come forward to offer funding for each of the new flag units that represent each of the 100 men killed during the WWII Battle on Iwo Jima.

A list of the 100 men KIA on Iwo Jima is listed on the reverse of this notice. The choice of which of the 100 men to sponsor will be given to family members first, if desired. The cost to sponsor one of these flag units is \$ 80. We hope to have each of the 100 flag units sponsored and in place by Veterans Day 2011.
